Animation Workshop

When you watch a film do you marvel at the realism in the visual effects work? In the film 'Avatar' it's estimated it took 47 working hours to complete one frame of the film. There are 24 frames in every second of run time to put that in perspective. Creating these digital wonders is the task of visual effects artists, one of whom we were privileged enough to have come to QCC.

A visual effects artist, Nikora Ngaropo, who is employed by Weta Digital, ran a young animators course for thirty Year 9 and 10 students. Nikora has also worked on other blockbusters such as The Hobbit; Iron Man; The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe, and The Adventures of Tintin. Over two days the course allowed us to delve into the basics of animation and visual effects, with Nikora encouraging us to always think outside of the box. From the 29th to the 30th of November we squirreled away inside the QCC hall, working on a range of activities.

In the course we worked on hand drawn flip-book animations, lego animations, learnt to use 3D pens and did some human armature animation. The 3D pens were 'pens' that you could use to paint hot melted plastic onto the table to form 3D shapes. We also make skeleton armatures out of wire and tried to replicate human movement with the wire figurine. It was extremely difficult and required no small amount of patience. In this process we would take a single photograph and then move the figure's position. Around 15-20 pictures would make up one second of our finished product. Each group learnt how to set up a 'greenscreen' and this could be used to change the background to another image, resulting in some pretty cool effects.

We also played some thinking and bonding games, with a prize of a bag of chocolate for the winners to share with their group. Talk about boosting team morale! We worked in six groups, each with five students who had to collectively assign and agree on roles to ensure the tasks were done. Over the duration of the course we had to learn how to collaborate effectively. What I took away from the course were some new skills and animation techniques while also having heaps of fun. Patience was definitely tested at times but the rewards were well worth it. Thank-you Nikora for coming to our school and giving us an opportunity we will never forget. Your work in visual effects is amazing, and to come to a small town like Picton to share this knowledge with us is both kind and inspirational for us all.

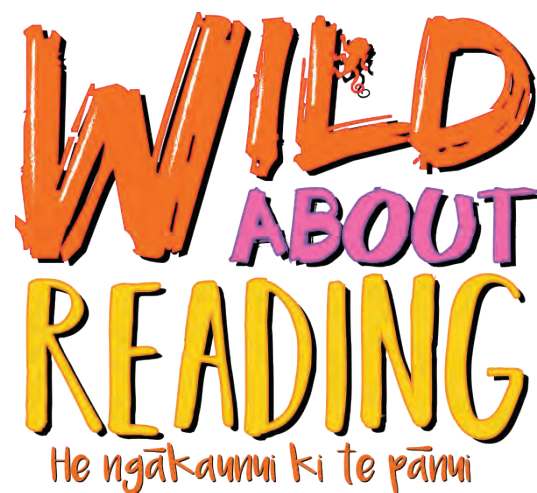

Waitohi Domain future uses – what do you think?

Marlborough District Council is considering potential future uses for Picton's Waitohi Domain, including for a temporary truck park while the State Highway One rebuild continues to generate more truck traffic in Picton.

Locals are encouraged to do an online survey and give Council their views.

The Domain has some significant limitations. It was once the site of a landfill, meaning it contains potentially harmful subsoil which restricts its use for some activities. The Domain is also an overflow area for the Waitohi Stream during flooding – a large part of it must be retained as floodway reserve.



There is also a proposal for a helicopter take-off and landing site in the north east corner of the Domain, which will go through a resource consent process. If approved this would enable sightseeing trips for cruise ship passengers and other tourism related uses.

There may be other ideas for Waitohi - this is an opportunity for locals to tell us what they think. The survey closes at 5.00 pm, Sunday 7 January.

Two days to go!

State Highway 1 (SH 1) north of Kaikoura will be open to traffic during the afternoon of Friday 15 December, restoring the coastal link from Picton to Christchurch.

The reopening gives people two viable options for travel around the upper South Island, with the alternate route (via state highways 63, 6, 65 and 7 through Lewis Pass) remaining a reliable option for travel.



When the road reopens several sites will still be under construction. There will be unsealed surfaces, lane closures and stop/go traffic controls. The route will be closed at night in places for several months as a safety precaution, and planned closures will also be needed at times to carry out high-impact work. The full rebuild will continue in 2018.

The page will be updated regularly with more information – including photos and video footage - about what to expect on the route as the reopening date approaches.

Whatever route people choose to take, allow plenty of extra time when planning journeys. Both routes have their own challenges so think about the best option for you.

The estimated travel time to drive between Picton and Christchurch on State Highway 1 when it re-opens in December is expected to be a minimum of 5½ hours. Driving on the alternate route is expected to take a minimum of 6½ hours.

Work will continue next year to bring SH 1 back to its pre-earthquake condition and complete improvement on the 60 km section between Clarence and Oaro. Improvements will also continue to be delivered on the alternate route.
