On 16 to 18 February the InterIslander Optimist challenge & Port Marlborough Starling championship once again takes over the Picton Harbour waters.

The Optimist challenge is a ranking regatta for optimist sailors and will also provide a challenge between the North and South Island, with a trophy up for grabs. The South Island definitely faces a challenge, as most sailors will be from the North Island and all top Optimist sailors will be there. The Port Marlborough Starling champs is part of the Starling Travellers Series and again, no top sailors want to miss this one. Around 180 sailors and their coaches, support crew and family will descend on Picton this weekend.



Even though the QCYC base was recently damaged by the “Blue Moon” storm, she will be ready for this event. The boatshed will convert into a beachside café. The club canon will be fired at nine o'clock am on Friday morning Feb 16 to open the event officially. After that the Open Optimist fleet and the Starling fleet will head out to the outer Harbour to start Racing. They will race for 3 days. The Optimist Green and Rainbow fleets will race only on Sat and Sun. Their racing will be in front of the club and Shelly beach for everyone to see.

QCYC will host the famous “Taste of Marlborough” for competitors and their crew, showcasing a lot of Marlborough’s produce. QCYC members and other volunteers will make sure the regatta will run like clockwork. There will be junior sailors from QCYC in each fleet. Learn to Sail graduates in the Rainbow fleet. Second year sailors in the Green fleet and the more competitive ones in the Open optimist and Starling fleets. Watch out for QCYC sailor Emily Overend in the Starling fleet. The highest ranked QCYC sailors in the Open fleet will be Louie Poletti and the Hopkins brothers, River and Moss. One thing is certain. It is a lot of work, but it will be a lot of fun!

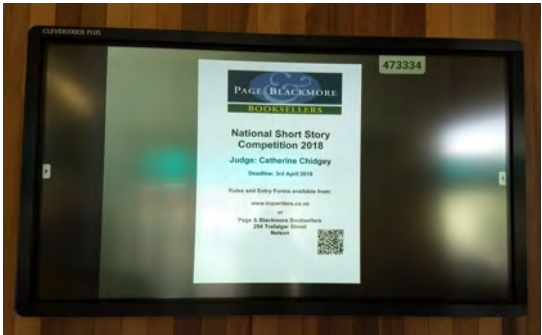

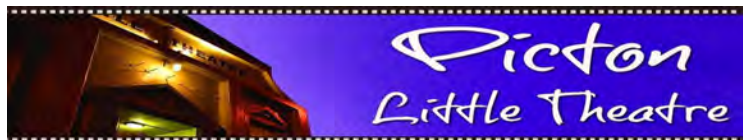

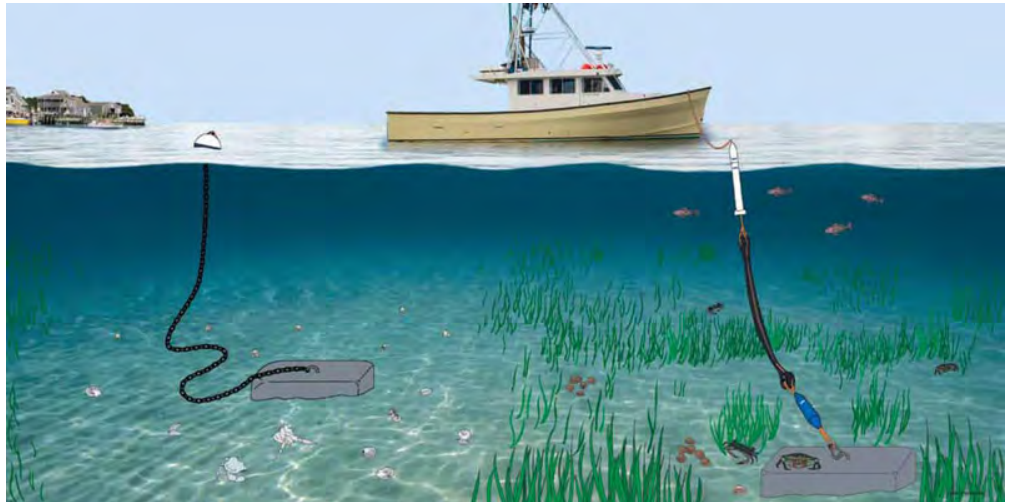

Seabed-friendly moorings

Councillors received a report last week on the environmental effects of moorings on different types of marine habitat in the Marlborough Sounds.

Council's Coastal Scientist Dr Steve Ulrich says there are over 3,000 swing moorings for boats in the Marlborough Sounds and some could be causing damage to fragile seabed habitats.



The report shows that the dragging of the ground chain can damage or destroy sensitive habitats resulting in the loss of fish spawning and nursery areas within a 360 degree arc around the mooring anchor block.

Acting Chair of Council's Environment Committee Gerald Hope welcomes the report. "We need this sort of information to help us build a broader picture of what goes on under the water and to better understand the effects of different types of disturbances to our seabed ecosystems."

This information will identify at risk areas and will help inform the Council's regulatory functions in future.

Rural homeowners need to be 'Fire Smart'

The further you live out of town, the longer it's going to take emergency services to reach your property in the event of fire. Distance means a house fire in the country can have disastrous consequences, especially if no one is around when it begins.

If you live in a rural setting there are some simple measures you can take to help minimise fire risk:



- Ensure there is 'defendable' space around your house – with only non-combustible vegetation next to the walls of the house.
- Store all fuels including firewood well away from your dwelling. You are setting up a bonfire under your deck if you store dry firewood or any other fuel under it.
- Clean out the guttering of your house regularly. Dry twigs and leaves make a perfect ember bed for firebrands or sparks from any fire nearby. Once a fire gets under the eaves and into the roof cavity there is a good chance the house will be lost.
- Make sure your RAPID number is clearly visible at the entrance to your property.

Marlborough Kaikoura Fire and Emergency New Zealand manages the rural fire district that extends across Marlborough and Kaikoura's rural fire areas.
