Surveying Garden Birds in Picton

Last week, Dr. Jan Wright, the Parliamentary Commissioner for the Environment, released her report “Taonga of an Island Nation”, which highlighted what a desperate situation that our native birds are in. New Zealand is a land of birds and has 168 native species, many of which are endemic (found nowhere else on Earth). Tragically, 4 out of 5 are in trouble and 1 in 3 are in serious trouble. The main threat? Introduced predators.

In Picton we are lucky to have the Kaipupu Sanctuary on our doorstep and hundreds of volunteers who have been working for years to restore the birdlife there. Now the whole community is also getting involved and creating safe habitat outside the Sanctuary in the form of a pest free “halo”. But how will we know if we are actually making a difference?

In order to know what is happening to our bird numbers and species we need to carry out regular monitoring. This has already been going on at Kaipupu to compare bird abundance inside and outside the Sanctuary. Picton Dawn Chorus are also doing monitoring of birds around Picton/Waikawa town to track the effects of the community’s trapping efforts.

In addition to the monitoring being carried out by Kaipupu and PDC, there is a wonderful opportunity for the whole community to assist in a much larger study of birds in New Zealand – the Landcare Research and Forest & Bird annual “Garden Bird Survey”. It is not onerous to take part and the more people that contribute, the better our understanding will become. This year, the survey will take place between 24 June and 2 July. Make yourself a cup of tea, settle in to a comfy chair and spend just one hour watching and noting the birds in your garden. We promise that you feel all the better for it and at the same time you will be contributing valuable data.

This is what you need to do to take part:

1. Choose any ONE day between 24th June and 2nd July.
2. Look for birds for ONE hour in your survey area.
3. Record the species and the HIGHEST number seen (or heard) at one time.
4. Submit your results online at gardenbirdssurvey.landcareresearch.co.nz

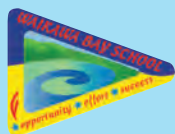
Waikawa Bay School

A meeting was held on 15 May 2017 to discuss the Catholic Community's vision of the future of Catholic Education in Picton.

We were grateful for the good number of people who supported this meeting and for the wide range of thoughts shared.

The general feeling at the meeting was one of support for St Joseph's School. Whilst this is our dearest wish, the Board of Trustees significant and repeated efforts to secure a permanent teaching principal over the last three years have been unsuccessful. Without the support of families of primary aged children, and with just two pupils and no teacher after 7 July 2017, the Board, as the governing body and employer of the school, are forced into an untenable position.

It is with deep regret and sadness the Board of Trustees will now ask the Minister for Education and the Proprietor to initiate the process of the cancellation of the Integration Agreement of St Joseph's School Picton. This follows our unanimous decision, together with Fr John as the Parish Priest, on this matter.

This is not a simple or quick process. We will keep you in touch with the steps as they evolve. This includes investigating alternative forms of Catholic Education across the whole of Star of the Sea Parish Marlborough. Already, we have some parishioners interested in this.

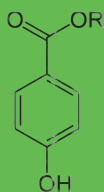

June is a busy month for us at the Library and Service Centre.

Be prepared for wet winter conditions in the Marlborough Sounds

Maintaining public roading and the Sounds stormwater systems requires constant attention from Marlborough Roads to keep culverts and channels clear. During intense storms, the systems can deteriorate quickly, and patrol crews are sent out to ensure the roads are safe and any urgent maintenance can be done.

Sounds property owners can help reduce flood risk by ensuring drains and watercourses on their properties are well maintained. Absent owners should arrange for regular checks to be made on their property. It's good practice to:

- Check waterways on the property and keep them clear.
- Undertake a regular check of culverts and water channels.
- Ensure someone is on site during storms to re-divert any water overflow.
- Alert Marlborough Roads to any concern about public roads. Heavy rain or an earthquake can cause a slip or landslide. Removing trees or vegetation or steep roadside cuttings can also cause land to slip, as can leaky water pipes. Conditions can change quickly so it's important to recognise the warning signs and

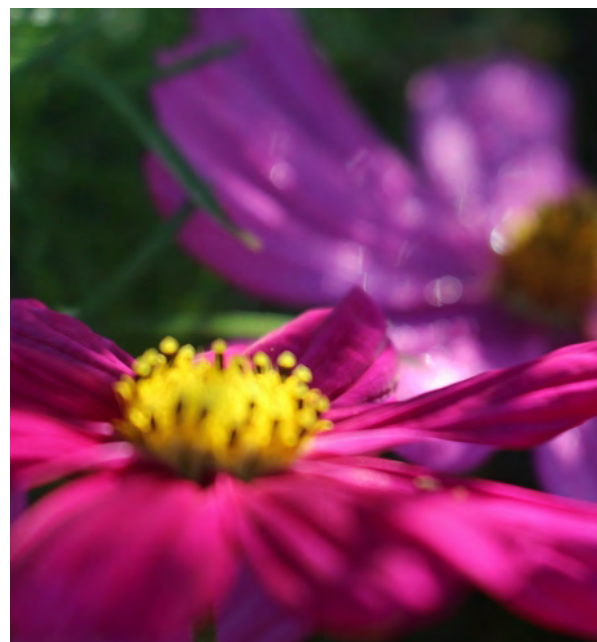

For anyone driving on Sounds roads or in the area: Conditions can change quickly so it's important to recognise the warning signs and take action. Be particularly observant when driving on Sounds roads in very wet weather.

Waitohi Rugby results (10th June 2017)

After a two week break the **Crafar Crouch Waitohi Premier** side returned to their home ground at Endeavour Park hosting Central, this was the first time they had taken the field after the death of promising 22 year old prop Bevan Moody. Central got out to an early 14 nil lead scoring two tries against the run of play, all Waitohi could muster by half time was a penalty to Tim O'Malley. In the second half the Tohi boy piled on the pressure and almost the entire second half was played out inside the Central half and much of that was inside their 22, all credit to Central for determined defence. Waitohi ran in two more tries early on taking an early lean 17 – 14 before a long range try to Central looked like the Tohi boys might loose their grip on third place. However the home team dug deep and camped inside the Central 22 until the pressure finally told and replacement halfback Karlos Tautari dotted down to give Waitohi the win 24 – 21 and increasing the gap back to forth to 12 points and 25 points clear of loosing a playoff spot. The race is now on to win the second round and finish top of the table.



The Under 14 competition was restructured and the unbeaten **KAM Transport Waitohi Under 14** team were starting again on zero points like everybody else. They played the curtain raiser to the premier side against the much vaunted Nelson College Blue side, Waitohi were down several key players and that meant a lack of reserves and fitness was always going to be an issue, the coaching staff needn't have worried with the Tohi Wranglers making no show of the first half running out to a big lead, it wasn't until late in the second half Nelson College showed any sign of a fight, the final score was 31 – 17. The **Fresh Choice Picton Waitohi Under 12** team players were big winners with a 72 - 7 win over Central away at Lansdowne Park.


