Marlborough Sounds Barbershop Chorus

The Barbershop style of singing developed in the USA in the 1930s as a form of extempore singing, communicated by ear rather than with musical notation, though songs soon began to be recorded in score. Barbershop singing is based around a melody sung by a 'Lead' singer in quartet or by the Lead section of a chorus. The other three singers in a quartet, or three sections in a chorus, sing Bass, Baritone and Tenor in harmony with the melody enabling us to sound or 'ring' chords that contain harmonic notes that are not actually sung and may be felt, not just heard, by the listener as a tingling sensation. The melodies may be taken from anywhere and arranged specifically for barbershop singing; they may be traditional or modern, well-known or less so, and they have sometimes been composed just as barbershop songs.

Barbershop singing has attracted a growing international following with choruses all around the world. As such, the Marlborough Sounds Chorus was founded in the mid-1990s by an enthusiastic group of guys who liked to sing in the a capella or unaccompanied barbershop style of singing. Each year there is a National Convention of 'Barbershoppers' in New Zealand, at which over the years the Marlborough Sounds Chorus has won many awards for their spirited singing, including 'Best Small Chorus' and 'Most Improved Chorus' at the larger Pan-Pacific Convention last year.

Directed by Dr Rod Bird, our chorus practices every Monday night. New members are welcome, young and old. If you have a desire to sing, come along and listen, join in and join up if you like what we do. There is no requirement that you can read music or that you have 'a fine voice': singing like talking is a skill that can be learnt. The only requirement is that you are male.

The annual National Convention this year is being held in Tauranga, and as part of our build up, we are holding a concert in Picton on Saturday the 28th July at 7pm. There will be quartet and chorus singing. We will be joined by Picton's own A Capella Belles, an all female chorus directed by Vicky Gardiner, who sing in the unaccompanied style, not just barbershop. Female choruses that sing in the barbershop style used to be known as Adeline singers.

So, male or female, if you simply like listening to unaccompanied singing or if you want to find out more about the barbershop style, please come along. There will be plenty of willing members who will be delighted to explain more. A gold coin donation will be gratefully accepted as an entrance fee to help cover costs.

Vicki Lee has been entertaining audiences for over 40 years. She has played with many bands over the years, mostly piano, and in more recent years the successive Yamaha Tyros Keyboards which have enabled her to become a self-sufficient musician with full orchestral sounds in the mix. All these sounds are played live, which have made her sought after by Entertainers such as the late great Sir Howard Morrison, who enjoyed her ability to spontaneously follow his often unrehearsed lead. She has subsequently toured the country with him on several occasions, as well as International functions in Las Vegas, Samoa and Hamilton Island.

Vicki has also had the privilege of working with, and accompanying Dame Malvina Major on many occasions, memorably the tours: "A Knight with a Dame", "My Life in Song", "Dame Malvina Majors Jubilee Tour".

Vicki was an essential member of the group "String of Pearls", featuring herself, Cyndi-Joe, and Mirie Murray. This band enjoyed huge popularity from the early 1990's through to 2006. The trio became a Duo with Vicki and Cyndi leading the charge at many prestigious conferences and functions nation-wide. Their popularity remains strong to this day. Vicki and Cyndi take credit for the first ever bi-lingual version of the New Zealand national anthem performed in Palmerston North at a rugby-league international game. From there they became the "Anthem Singers" for many international sporting events, specifically Netball where they learned and sang many countries anthems along with their own. Vicki has recorded C.D.'s with the "String of Pearls", and also has her own Solo album "Goin' Back". She graduated from Massey University with a Bachelor of Arts, majoring in music. She teaches piano from home, the Simply Music method which advocates playing based success being the focus with the reading process naturally evolving along the way.

In 2017 she visited Dame Vera Lynn's Sussex home to celebrate the musical legend's 100th birthday, and perform a concert to raise money for Lynn's charity. Vicki has been touring the Life and Music of Dame Vera since 2015, and performed successful concerts in the North Island and the United Kingdom. This is her first venture into the South Island.

Despite the howling bitterly cold wind & the torrential rain, five girls & their caregivers turned up to help out the leaders empty the aluminium can banks! Look how many cans we have saved from landfill in just the last two terms - the big white bags are full of empty crushed cans.

We look after 3 can recycling stations on behalf of the Picton & Marlborough Sounds community; they are located in Waikawa Marina (East side by the bathroom block), Picton Marina (at the recycling station by the boat wash), and outside the Scout Den/Men's Shed (Market Street). We empty the can banks about once a term, twice a term in summer. When our storage compound is full, the cans are taken away for recycling by a local company.

This community project is important for Girl Guiding as we are putting our Guide Promise & Laws into action:

- We are taking action for a better world (reduce-reuse-recycle... we are setting a great example in our community)
- We are taking care of the environment (we are stopping these cans from ending up in Landfill - instead they get recycled and the aluminium made into new products)

- We are using our time and abilities wisely
- We are facing challenges & learning from experiences (the weather!)

First the Minister was introduced to the Envirohub Marlborough and a variety of groups dealing with issues from plastics use to pine control, captive breeding to climate change. You name the conservation issue, Marlborough has someone trying to make a difference!

Then the Committees of Picton Dawn Chorus and the Kaipupu Point Wildlife Sanctuary showed the Minister the two projects from the water, thanks to Cougar Line, providing her with a good overview of the huge community effort that has been invested.

The main event of the day was the Minister's speech at our Public Meeting. Minister Sage spoke about her intentions and hopes for conservation and covered many different topics. She highlighted the importance of communities and individuals getting involved to make a difference in protecting our unique, native species. There was an opportunity for questions from the audience and a huge variety of issues were raised.

The Minister's visit highlights how much our community has got behind predator control. However, we still have some work to do to get a good trap coverage over the whole town. Victoria Domain Reserve Management Plan Review

In 1995 a Reserve Management Plan was published for the Victoria Domain and related reserves (including Shelley Beach, Memorial Park, Waikawa Recreation Reserve and Endeavour Park). Some 23 years later much has changed in the way people use and value these reserve areas, and these changes are to be considered in developing a new plan. Te Ātiawa o Te Waka-a-Māui Trust and Marlborough District Council are working together to prepare a new plan and would like to hear from you.

You are invited under Section 41 of the Reserves Act 1977 to provide suggestions or feedback on this first stage of the review. The reviewed reserve management plan will provide an overall vision for the Domain and will help guide decisions about how the Council and others will manage and use this area over the next 10 years.

Suggestions and feedback can be made in writing and sent to: Linda Craighead, Reserves Planner, Marlborough District Council, PO Box 443, Blenheim 7240. Suggestions and feedback can also be emailed to victoriadomainreview@marlborough.govt.nz.

The closing date for receiving suggestions and feedback is 17 August 2018.

There is no set format for providing your feedback or suggestions. There is a form you can download from the MDC website if you wish. You can also use an online form available on the MDC website. Information about the review and forms are also available on the Te Ātiawa website. We would like to know:

- how you use the Victoria Domain reserves
- what you like or don't like about the reserves
- are there particular values important to you?
- what you think the reserves could or should look like in the future?

From this consultation, a draft plan will be prepared which will then be available for formal submissions later this year. Maritime VHF Radio Certificate

Mon 3rd & Weds 5th September, 6pm - 9pm
Ogilvie Lee Emergency Operations Centre, Picton

Qualification: Maritime VHF Radio Operator Certificate.

Any person operating a maritime VHF radio must hold, as a minimum requirement, a Maritime VHF Radio Operator Certificate (unless transmitting in an emergency or a distress situation).

Knowing how to use a maritime VHF radio correctly and with confidence is vital in the event of an emergency. This course covers the protocols that must be followed when communicating over the maritime radio network. Maritime VHF radios can be used for receiving weather forecasts, safety information, communicating between boats, or communicating boat to shore.

The Maritime VHF Radio Operator Certificate course covers the general features and functions of a maritime VHF radio, correct distress and urgency procedures for 'Mayday' and 'Pan Pan' calls, pro-words and phonetic alphabet, trip reports, weather services, callsigns, EPIRBS and other search and rescue equipment.
