During the school holidays I went to Lake Rotoiti to take part in the Mana Rangatahi programme. It was for me to learn more about my Iwi (Ngati Apa Ki te Ra To).

We arrived at Omaka Marae on Monday and had a powhiri. I was nervous and scared to begin with but then I quickly started to feel more comfortable. After the powhiri we learnt each other's names and got put into some lines that we would use when learning Taiaha.

The next morning the bus arrived and we were packed and ready to go. The bus took a couple of hours to get there, and when we arrived we unpacked and had some Kai.

We started Taiaha training which I was really excited for, then we went for a walk down to the lake. We saw some eels and learnt about the Maori names for the mountains around us.

We also learnt some hand games which was really cool.

The following day we woke up at 6am to start training and we spent most of the day doing that and learning our Mihi. We had to do our Mihi in front of everyone when we went down to the river.

On Thursday we went to Rainbow Ski field which took a really long time. I tried skiing for the first time and nailed it! At the end of the day we got back on the bus and drove all the way back to Omaka.

Friday was the last day for us to practice everything we had learnt and we finished the day off with a dance party. The following day our whanau were invited to Omaka to watch our performance. We were scared at first but felt really proud of ourselves. We showed our whanau our Taiaha skills then went into Wharenui to show them our Mihi, handgames and Waiata that we had learnt.

Overall my favourite part was watching the video at the end to see everything we had done. It was a great opportunity and I will definitely go again next year.

We made pottery with Bec and we made fish. We worked in the art room and created our own fish designs. After we made them she put them in a special oven. Then when I got to school they were all scattered along the kindy wall like a blue wave pushing a shoal of fish along. I think they look amazing.

Step 4 We designed patterns on our fish using lots of different tools. Step 5 We painted them with some cool colours. Step 6 Bec's cooked them in a special oven and glazed them. Then when we came to school on the first day of this term our fish had appeared on the wall but I knew Bec must have put them there because I saw some glue on the wall too!

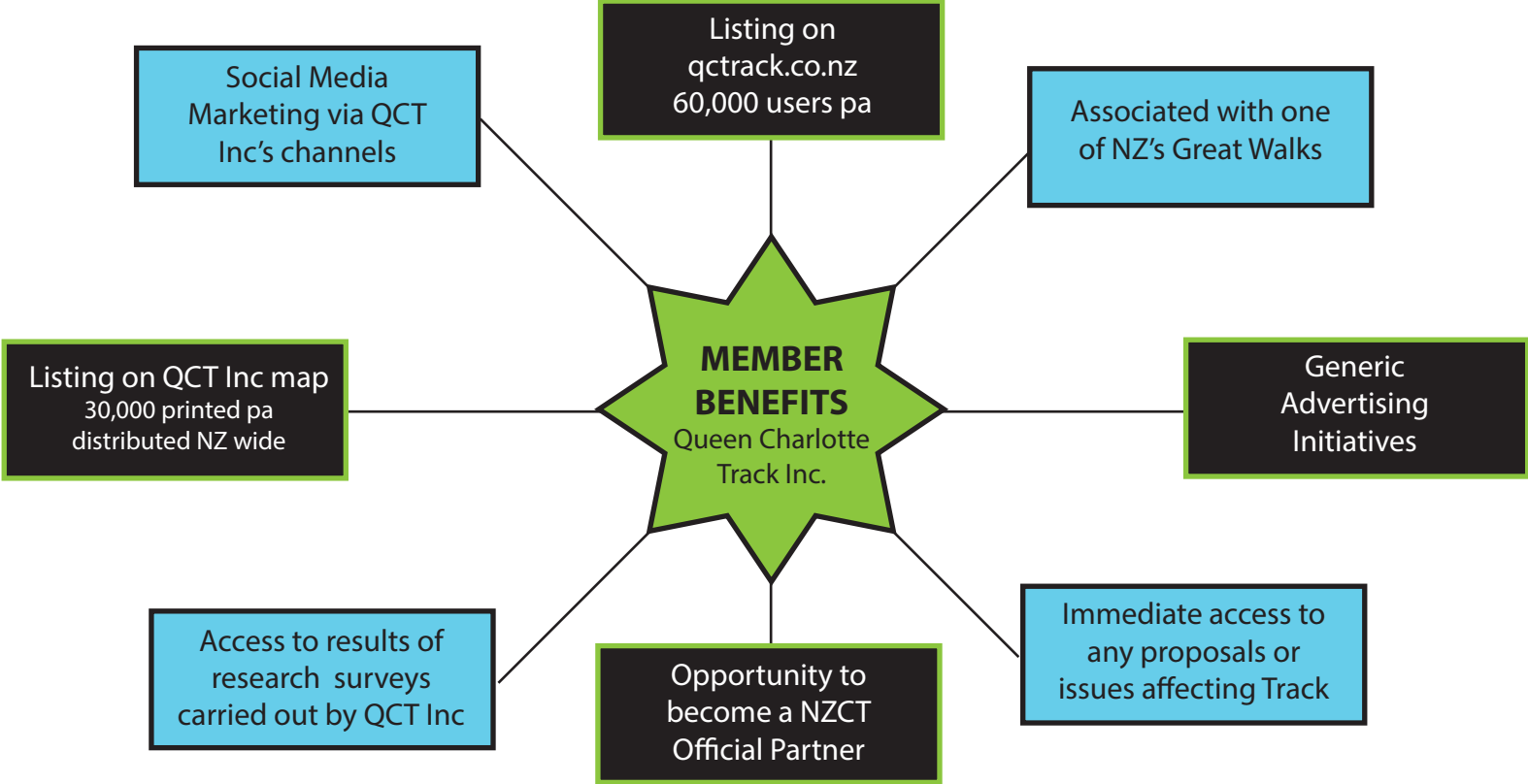


Exciting times are coming up for the Queen Charlotte Track
