# Helping kiwi kids into sport

Friday, March 9, 2018 is the cut-off date for the latest round of KiwiSport funding and Sport Tasman community sport manager Mel Greenwood urges schools, sports clubs/organisations and community groups to get their applications in as soon as possible.

Last year approximately \$285,000 was distributed across the Tasman area to a variety of recipients. Greenwood said the procedure for applying for funding is not onerous and she was readily available to help.

"It is a good opportunity for any organisation that delivers sport for youth. We'd like to see applications submitted from organisations right across our region, which includes Buller, Tasman, Nelson, Marlborough and Kaikoura. I urge them to have a chat to me about their project if they haven't already."

"The funding can make a huge difference, especially in the smaller areas. Previous grants have ranged from \$300 up to \$30,000 so the scale varies depending on the size of the organisation and how many kids they are working with. It can be a game-changer."

This year Sport NZ has directed Regional Sports Trusts give priority to projects that focus on low socio-economic groups, opportunities for girls and delivery outside of school curriculum time.


The new directives from Sport NZ mean that if applicants target those areas they may have a stronger application, added Greenwood.

KiwiSport is a government funding initiative administered by Sport Tasman to increase participation in sport for school-aged children.

Sport Tasman distributes funds through two funding rounds each year. The first funding round of 2018 closes at 5pm on March 9 while the second round cut off is Friday, August 10. The objectives of KiwiSport are "More Kids, More Opportunities, Better Skills". KiwiSport aims to increase the number of school-aged children participating in organised sport, improve the availability and accessibility of sport opportunities for all children aged between five and 18 and support them in developing skills that will enable them to participate effectively in sport.

All groups receiving KiwiSport funds are expected to contribute at least 50% of total project costs.

## Second-Hand Sunday

Take the opportunity to pass on unwanted but useable items - The first Second-Hand Sunday for 2018 is February 11. Here's how it works:

Register your address in advance if you have goods to give away. Registered properties will be listed on this website.

Put out a Second-Hand Sunday A4 poster at your letterbox on Sunday 11 February so people know you have items to give away. Posters are available at Council or can be printed.

Put the items together in a neat pile, either at your letterbox or next to your driveway.

Remove the sign at 1.00 pm and pack up any leftover items. It's your responsibility to remove anything left behind. If you leave it outside your property boundary then you are in breach of the dumping rubbish bylaw.

Remember:

- Take items only from properties advertised and where the Second-Hand Sunday sign is displayed.
- Don't arrive before 10.00 am or after 1.00 pm.
- Don't enter the property; items should be at the front gate.
- If you have uncollected goods you may wish to donate them to a charity shop or take them to the Re-use Shop or Transfer Station.

## New water play area for Picton foreshore

**The new water play feature on Picton's foreshore is a magnet for children this summer and Council reserves and amenities manager Jane Tito says it's a lovely tribute to the elderly man who bequeathed his estate to the Picton foreshore.**

More than \$100,000 was left for foreshore enhancement by 90-year-old Christchurch man Cliff Hague who'd spent his holidays in the town since his childhood.

The new water play area has replaced the old paddling pool.

Councillors have just approved \$260,000 for more improvements to the Picton Foreshore Reserve. Mrs Tito says there will now be funding available for shade sails and seating around the water play area. With the foreshore already too busy with summer activities to close off for construction, the work will begin after Easter.

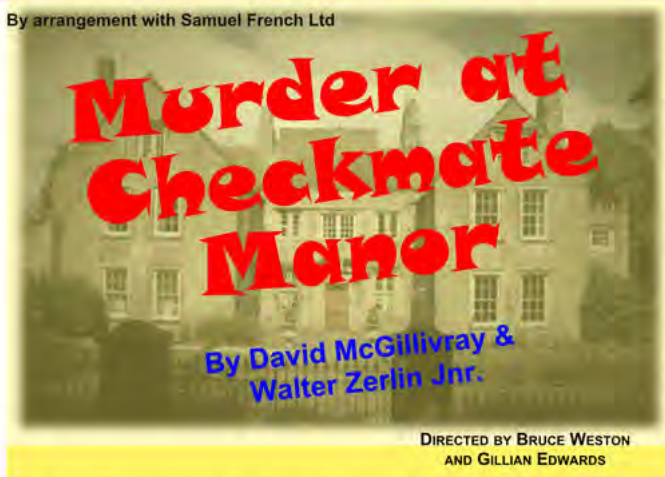
