Minister of Conservation to speak in Picton

Picton Dawn Chorus is please to announce that the Minister of Conservation is visiting Picton on Monday July 16th, and will be speaking to a public meeting that evening.

Everyone is welcome to come to hear Eugenie Sage speak at the Queen Charlotte College hall, at 7 pm.

Picton Dawn Chorus (PDC) was formed, primarily to protect Kaipupu from predators, a few months prior to the Government announcement of an official goal of achieving a predator free New Zealand by 2050. While a great many community groups dealing with predators have been formed well before PDC and many after, Picton Dawn Chorus's launch happily coincided with the Government announcement. We are grateful for the publicity we attained and proud of the results we have achieved so far.

The Minister's visit further highlights the importance of what PDC is doing and it will be very interesting to hear what the new Government's plans are for the future. It is plain to see that to achieve a predator free New Zealand, the myriad of small community groups carrying out predator control must ultimately link up into larger organisations to cover the country. The difficulty is to maintain the high level of commitment within local groups with the need to merge.

Some regions have achieved large scale predator control, but this has taken significant input from local Councils, the disparate groups and the army of volunteers. We look forward to hearing how the government might assist Marlborough in achieving the goal of becoming predator free.

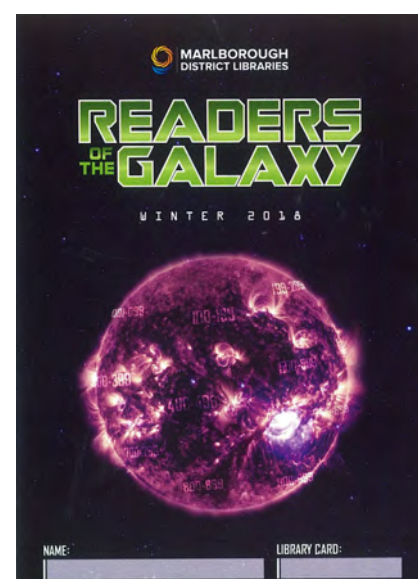
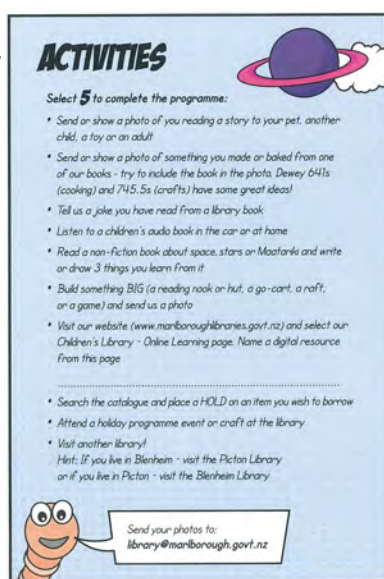

Gates open at Truck Park

Picton's Waitohi Domain truck park is now open, much to the delight of truckies from up and down New Zealand who regularly stop in Picton before hopping on the ferry.

After weeks of work and delays due to wet weather, the fences are up, the pavement is sealed and road marking is complete, meaning truck drivers no longer have to park on the street. Council is developing a planting and landscaping plan around the facility and along Dublin Street to beautify the Domain's frontage and enhance the surrounding area.

The decision to opt for a truck park came as a result of a public survey asking for feedback on potential future uses for Waitohi Domain. Over three-quarters of those surveyed were in favour of a truck park, which will ease the congestion created by heavy vehicles parking in Picton's streets.

Council Assets and Services Manager Richard Coningham said given the Domain had limitations in terms of its use - it was once a landfill and is an overflow area for heavy rainfall - the truck park is a good fit for the current space.

"However, once SH 1 is fully operational again and the demand for a truck park is lower, Council intends to rent the area to a suitable tenant to generate a return on investment," Richard said.

Have your say on Council services

Each year the Council surveys residents to find out their level of satisfaction with our services. The 2018 survey has just begun and will continue until mid-July. The telephone and online survey is run by independent researchers SIL Research, with respondents asked questions about a range of services, and asked to give a satisfaction score of one to 10. Respondents are also invited to complete the survey online and via Council's Facebook page.

Council uses the results to measure performance in areas like transport, water supply and community facilities. The results help us to understand the public's priorities and to plan for the future.

Phone calls are made during the day, evenings and at weekends, to reach a cross-section of residents reflecting the demographic makeup of Marlborough. Householders may be asked if someone from a certain age group is available. This is to ensure the survey is representative of Marlborough's age groups.

The results are published in October.

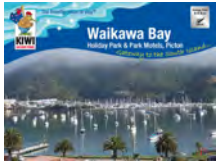

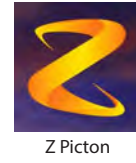

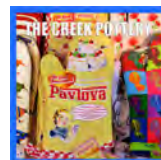
