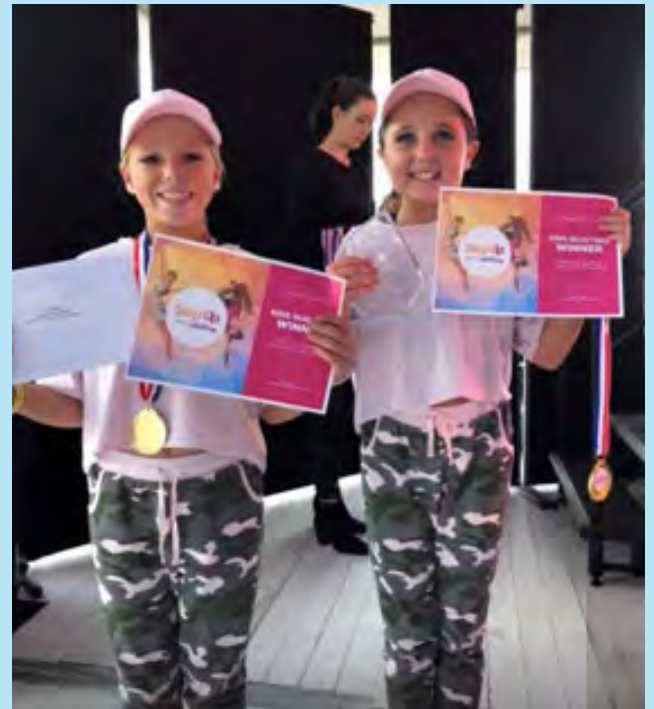
# Waikawa Bay School

## Waitohi Domain trucking along

It's full steam ahead as work to transform part of Picton's Waitohi Domain into a temporary vehicle park facility gets underway.

Council contractors are in the final stages of the project with the ground works now complete. Next week they will begin laying the chip seal before adding the final touches including line marking, and fencing the area.

The decision to opt for a temporary truck park comes as a result of a survey that asked for feedback on potential uses for Waitohi Domain. Three-quarters of people who completed the survey were in favour of the truck park being built on the Domain, to ease nearby congestion by heavy vehicles parking in Picton's streets.

Council will also plant and landscape the area around the facility and along Dublin Street. Work on the project is on track to be completed in the next couple of weeks. Once SH 1 is fully operational again and the requirement for a truck park is less, Council intends to rent the area to a suitable tenant.

## Autumn leaves arrive

Autumn is here and sweeping of kerbs, channels and carriageways of our roads is underway.

Sweeping footpaths is not part of regular maintenance work by Council unless a safety risk is being caused by debris. So it's appreciated if residents are able to assist by keeping footpaths clear outside your property. Street flooding can be prevented by the simple neighbourly act of removing rubbish or leaves from roadside drains.

Residents can help by checking street drains outside their properties when heavy rain is forecast. If you're in a low-lying or flood-prone area, clearing away rubbish or leaves may avert flooding. After a rainstorm, it helps everything dry out much faster if water build-up can drain away quickly.

If you spot a blockage or need a hand to clear a drain or footpath, call the Council on 03 520 7400.

## Secure your recycling in windy weather

With windy Autumn weather setting in, make sure you pack your recycling crate securely so the contents don't blow down the street.

You can secure waste paper by stacking heavier items on top. It's also a good idea to bundle up newspapers, either inside a plastic supermarket bag or tied with string. Don't overfill the crate – make sure everything is placed inside the bin, not stacked next to it.

Our kerbside recycling now accepts pizza boxes – but make sure they're jammed in firmly – and all the food scraps are removed.
